PALM SUNDAY



MARKINGS: Questions, Quotations and Exclamations from Fr. Mark

Today the Church begins the most solemn of her liturgical observances as we enter into Holy Week on this Sunday of the Lord's Passion, also known as "Palm Sunday." Today's observance gets its name from the biblical narrative of Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem the week before his death to celebrate the Passover with his disciples. In the Gospel according to John we read, "On the next day, when the great crowd that had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem, they took palm branches and went out to meet him, and cried out: "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, the king of Israel." (John 12:12-13)

On Palm Sunday, the liturgy begins with a festive procession from the place where palm branches are blessed to the church where the Eucharist is celebrated. In this symbolic commemoration of Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem, the Church demonstrates its commitment to follow Christ through the liturgical celebrations of the coming week, which will solemnly commemorate his last supper, his passion and death, and his resurrection.

I encourage all the members of our community to follow through as best they can on this commitment to enter into Holy Week with a generous spirit of devotion. This is a week to put aside daily routines and to suspend business as usual in order that we may come together to celebrate the Paschal Mystery of Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection. Please review the events scheduled for Holy Week here at St. Aloysius, especially those observances held during the Sacred Triduum of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday-Easter Sunday. These days tell and celebrate our most sacred story.


The passion narrative according to Mark begins with a story about a woman who anoints Jesus in Bethany with extremely costly perfume. Some who observe her act of kindness toward Jesus criticize her for it, observing that the costly perfume could have been better used by selling it and giving the money to the poor. Jesus tells those who criticize her to leave her alone, and he praises her for her generosity, noting that her action is a preparation for his burial. During Holy Week, the Church imitates the extravagant generosity of the woman of Bethany in her liturgical celebrations. We will hire musicians, purchase flowers, and have programs printed, all with funds that could be spent on other ministries – even to feed the hungry. We will spend an extravagant amount of time in planning, rehearsing, and attending liturgical services. Some will take time off from work, or from social events, or both in order to observe these most sacred of days. We do so because of the significance of the mystery we celebrate. Holy Week calls for a generous, even an extravagant response to the supremely extravagant and costly sacrifice of Jesus for us during that first Holy Week in Jerusalem. Let us all respond as best we can.
