On Friday, March 29, St. Aloysius hosted the kick-off of a new outreach effort for seniors in our area called *Connecting Seniors to Services*. St. Aloysius is participating with nine other churches in this faith-based outreach effort. Carol Bunn, the Director of our Food Pantry and Hunger Center, serves as one of the ten navigators in this program.

It all began in 2015, when the Cleveland Clergy Alliance in partnership with the Cuyahoga County Division of Senior and Adult Services conducted a study to better understand the current needs and/or concerns of seniors and adults with disabilities within a broad range of faith-based organizations. The purpose was to assist the organizations to identify service gaps in order to plan, collaborate and advocate to address and meet the unmet needs of seniors and adults with disabilities in Cuyahoga County.

Needs recognized by the congregations and currently being provided to the best of their abilities include: health care screenings, transportation, food pantry/soup kitchens, clothing, counseling, grief counseling, social activities and limited financial assistance. The clergy identified additional resources which were needed to assist seniors with staying in their homes and avoid more costly nursing home placement.

Through *Connecting Seniors to Services*, Navigators will assist seniors by removing barriers in areas of need such as medical health, insurance, transportation, dental health, mental health, financial literacy, housing, food deprivation, the cycle of social isolation, the ability to age safely in place with dignity and respect, and any yet unidentified unmet needs that can be addressed by accessing available programs and services. Navigators will also observe each individual for any signs of neglect, self-neglect, or abuse for referral to the Cuyahoga County Division of Senior and Adult Services (DSAS) and Senior Adult Protective Services (APS).

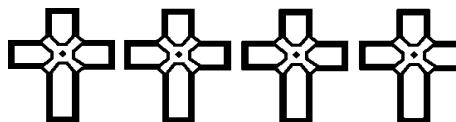
