## Markings Questions, Quotations and Exclamations



Holy Week begins the most solemn week of our year as Christians, as we recall the events that won our salvation in Christ. This week is not a re-enactment, but a time of ritual remembering, during which we not only recall the events that occurred in Jeru-

salem during the last week of Jesus' life, but we actually enter into the mystery of his suffering, death and resurrection. The power of Christ's Paschal Mystery is a force that transcends history and reaches through the ages, transforming us along with all the saints. In this way, we are renewed each year in Christ by our participation in the celebrations of the Church during Holy Week.

Let us all enter with solemn faith into the celebrations of the Sacred Three Days of Triduum. Today we have marched through our own streets with palm branches, both remembering the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem and also marking our own entrance into this sacred week. This is the time to turn off the televisions and step away from the computers; a time to silence the cell phone and turn off the radio – all in an effort to make sacred this week by making room for prayer and meditation in a focused and unique way. I encourage all of us to alter our schedules in order to spend time in prayer and to participate in the rituals scheduled in church this week.

In addition, this is a week to consider additional acts of charity and compassion. Who can you offer a sacrifice for in order to show forth to them the compassion and love of Christ? How might you make the world in which you live a more sacred place by your words or your actions? This is a week to consider how we too might carry the cross of Christ in our day and in our part of the world.

May Christ be adored and blessed by us all this week, for by his holy cross, he has indeed saved the world. .


