Markings ...Questions, Quotations and Exclamations from Fr. Mark Hobson

"When I am instructing our seminary students on the art of preaching, one of my favorite lessons is, "Don't just tell them

the message-SHOW them the message." Without concrete examples from real life to illustrate the Gospel message, there is a danger that the message will remain poetry, and not be fully understood as relevant to our lives. That is no doubt why Jesus told stories and used images when he taught. We learn from example.

On Friday of the past week, the Church celebrated her annual festival of All Saints. The Gospel that is selected to be read on that day at mass is a famous passage from the Gospel of Matthew, often referred to as "The Beatitudes." It is a poetic listing of wise sayings regarding what can truly make us happy in life. But it occurred to me as I prepared to preach on this passage to our school children that as beautiful as the words were, they would never grasp their meaning without concrete examples. What does "Blessed are the poor in spirit" mean to a child? In fact, what does it mean for an adult? What does it mean to be a "peacemaker," and how is a blessing to have your heart broken through the process of mourning?

The solution to the problem was no further away than the feast we were celebrating. It is in the lives of the saints that we find the examples that can unlock the meaning of the scriptures and inspire us to put that message into practice. By observing the lives of the saints, we can see the scriptures put into practice. In St. Monica, the mother of St. Augustine, we meet the holiness of tearful prayer. In St. Francis of Assisi, we find an example of true poverty of spirit. In Sr. Thea Bowman, we observe what it means to be a peacemaker. In Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., we discover what a life persecuted for righteousness means. The saints are the lived examples of the Word of God. It has been said that the only Gospel that some people will encounter is the gospel as iot is lived by the saints.

As we celebrate the great heroes of the Church - both the famous and the not-so-famous -I hope we can all be aware of our own calling to be the living Word of God for others. That's what makes a saint a saint.
