Markings ...Questions, Quotations and Exclamations from Fr. Mark Hobson

“On Tuesday of this past week, The Diocese of Cleveland bid farewell to its tenth bishop, Richard Girard Lennon. A native of Arlington, Massachusetts, Bishop Lennon was born on 26 March 1947. He was ordained to the priesthood on 19 May 1973 for service in the Archdiocese of Boston. He served as Parochial Vicar at Saint Mary of the Nativity Parish, Scituate, Massachusetts from June 1973 until June 1982. From June 1982 until June 1988, he served as Parochial Vicar at St. Mary Parish, West Quincy, Massachusetts. Bishop Lennon served as Assistant for Canonical Affairs for the Archdiocese of Boston and titular Bishop of from July 1988 until December 1998. In January 1999, Bishop Lennon was named Rector of St. John Seminary, Brighton, Massachusetts. On 14 September 2001, he was ordained a bishop to serve as Auxiliary Bishop of the Arch Diocese of Boston. He served as Apostolic Administrator of the Archdiocese of Boston from 13 December 2002 to 30 July 2003. From August 2003 until April 2006, he served as Vicar General and Moderator of the Curia of the Archdiocese of Boston. On 4 April 2006, he was appointed Bishop of Cleveland and was installed on 15 May 2006. On 28 December 2016, he retired as Bishop of Cleveland.

During his time as Bishop of Cleveland, Bishop Lennon faced some very difficult issues with regard to the closing and merging of parishes. The diocese was in need of resizing and re-organizing of parishes. It was a project that could never have ended with everyone being satisfied. I think it’s fair to say that Bishop Lennon arrived in the Diocese of Cleveland in one of the most tumultuous periods in its history. He did his best to respond to the needs of the times.

I attended the funeral Mass on Tuesday, along with most of the priests and many of the Sisters and laity of our diocese. I often have to talk myself into going to those large, formal ceremonies at the Cathedral. They just aren’t my style. However, I was surprised by the humble tenor of the ceremony. Of course, there was the long procession of clergy and the big music with orchestra and choir, but what struck me most was the humility of the preacher. He was a friend of Bishop Lennon from Boston, and this was his message, inspired by the words of Bishop Lennon before he died: “I don’t want a eulogy- no long list of my accomplishments. I am not a saint, and I am not perfect. Please commend me to the mercy of God through your prayers.” His friend complied. It was this that brought me to tears at Bishop Lennon’s funeral. It was a reminder that none of us will enter Heaven because of our achievements. It is only because we are unconditionally loved by God that we are saved. And it is in acknowledging that truth that we become great.

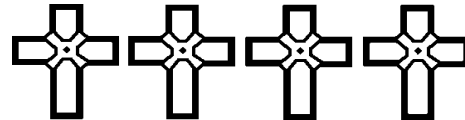
May Bishop Richard G. Lennon and all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.
