Fr Anthony's Word of the Week

I always begin my day with Mary. I begin each morning with Jesus in prayer and I begin my day with Our Mother Mary. When I sing in the morning, often it's to Mary. I

listen to Marian songs as I get ready.

On my dresser I have arranged three statues I look at every morning. Jesus of course is right in the middle, with His eyes facing me. St. Joseph is off to the one side sort of looking off in loving, docile contemplation as he holds the child Jesus in his arms. Mary is off the other side. I always arrange that she is turned towards me.

The way in which Mary looks on us, helps us and loves us is from her Son's side. Mary never left Jesus' side. When she followed, she was always close behind. From the moment she received Jesus in her womb to the moment He gave His last breath, She was there with Him. It is a joyful fact that when she was assumed into heaven, she would remain at Jesus' side for all eternity. However Mary does not just enjoy this blissful reward for herself. With joyful content that we can barely imagine, side by side with Jesus, she looks on us - her children. Whenever she approaches to embrace us, she is nonetheless close to Him.

Our love and devotion to Mary as a Mother comes nowhere near Jesus' love and devotion to her. sweet, overflowing, immaculate, motherly heart Mary has for Jesus flows out towards each of us -her precious sons We cannot come anywhere near and daughters. matching her love for us. She does treasure our love in return, which only gives her more freedom to love us. Why focus on Mary in the midst of this season that focuses entirely on Jesus? Isn't our goal to offer our life to Our Lord Jesus more entirely who gave His life entirely for us? There is no one who received Jesus more fully and offered their entire being to Him than Mary. Her heart is the floodgate that leads us into His. There is no closeness with Mary that doesn't bring us closer to Jesus.

In these precious remaining days of Lent, leading to Holy Week, let us draw closer to Our Mother. She will help us pray. She will protect us from the enemy. She will comfort us. She will help us cooperate with the graces and conversion Jesus desires for us. If she feels distant to you, as I once felt, I promise you she is not. May we strive to make every part of the rosary our daily prayer. May we say "Hail Mary" when we feel burdened, distressed or scared. May we seek refuge and childlike comfort as we gaze upon our favorite images of her, trusting she gazes upon us. After Jesus gave us the gift of Himself at Supper, He gave us this last gift in His words: "Behold your Mother."

Lenten Almsgiving

Lent is the season of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. One way you can give alms for the poor this Lent is to donate your change throughout the season to our St. Aloysius Food Pantry. Contribution cans are available for all who would like to contribute. Return your change-filled cans to church during Holy Week.

Lenten Fast and Abstinence

You are reminded that it is our tradition to fast and to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, and to abstain from meat during all the Fridays of Lent. **Fasting** means that a person eats only one full meal, and perhaps two lighter meals, per day. The obligation to fast begins at age eighteen and ends at age sixty. The obligation to abstain from meat begins at age fourteen.
