







Sr. Mary Jean's Reflection

In all the appearances after the Resurrection, Jesus begins his greetings with, "Peace be with you."

In the readings from Christmas we hear that the birth of Jesus occurred "when the whole world was at peace."

Today our world sorely needs to hear those words and enjoy the reality of a world at peace.

Major and minor conflicts are happening in numerous countries around the world with the threat of these conflicts escalating into ever widening and more serious wars.

Just like many animals who naturally curl into a defensive ball when they are provoked, countries are tempted to withdraw and put up walls of defense and resistance as they take the attitude that it is not really their problem since the conflicts are not touching their soil – yet.

In our own country we are seeing numerous states enact laws that restrict voter participation for dubious reasons. We are seeing a hardening of our hearts toward immigrants although there are currently more people on the move worldwide that at any other time in history.

In our own city we are seeing post COVID evictions rising at an alarming rate with over 50% of evictions affecting people of color although they are only 32% of the renters as well as a disproportionate number of women with children being evicted across the city.

It is truly a picture that could cause us to despair of ever finding a solution and still in the midst of it all we hear Jesus saying, "Peace be with you."

On the feast of Pentecost the Easter season will end and we will return to the time that the church calls "ordinary time." The times we live in today are far from ordinary.

Individuals, including ourselves have strayed far from gospel values which call us to live ordinary times in extraordinary ways. Where can we find our center? Where can we recapture the feeling of peace in our own lives and in our world?

I would suggest that we begin now to meditate on the gifts of the Holy Spirit which will once again be abundantly offered to us in two weeks on Pentecost Sunday. They are there for us to claim as our own – if we are open and aware of doing so.

Be on the lookout for the Spirit to gift you with wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, fear of the Lord and of course PEACE!
