Sr. Mary Jean's Reflection

This year marks the 40th anniversary of the pastoral letter of the Black Catholic bishops, What <u>We Have</u> <u>Seen and Heard.</u>

As part of this anniversary year, we are being asked to read and study

this historic document and to seek ways to make it an ongoing part of our personal and communal spirituality and social outreach activities.

On page nine there is a poignant reminder about the gift of joy. It seems especially timely for us today when we are in a national state of anxiety over the future of our country and the upcoming election.

The Gift of Joy. Excepts taken from the pastoral letter.

Joy is a hallmark of Black Spirituality. Joy is first of all celebration. Celebration is movement and song, rhythm and feeling, color and sensation, exultation and thanksgiving. We celebrate the presence and the proclamation of the Word.

This joy is a sign of our faith and especially our hope. It is never an escape from reality, however harsh it may be. Indeed this joy is often present even in the midst of deep anguish and bitter tears.

"...you will weep and mourn while the world rejoices; you will grieve for a time, but your grief will be turned into joy." (John 16:20)

This joy is a result of our conviction that "in the time of trouble, he will lead me..."

This joy comes from the teaching and wisdom of mothers and fathers in the Faith that, looking at Jesus, we must burst into sing so that all might hear.

One who is joyful is impelled to live and cannot hate. A joyful person seeks to reconcile and will not cause division. A joyful person is troubled by the sight of another's sadness. A joyful person seeks to console, strives to encourage and brings to all true peace.

Such is the gift so clearly needed in our time. Such is the gift Jesus Passed on to us the evening he died.

This joy was also very much in evidence at our opening school Mass when our children sang and clapped and entered into the liturgy with their whole hearts. I invite everyone who is able to attend our next school Mass in November. You will come away with hearts and spirits filled with joy. I guarantee it!

Last Chance to Register to Vote—October 7

Here is what you can do.

Contact your local County Board of Elections to check your registration status. Cuyahoga County residents can confirm their registration status by calling the County Board of Elections at 216-443-8683 (VOTE) or visiting the County BOE website at <u>https://boe.cuyahogacounty.gov.</u>

If your registration is purged or you are not registered to vote, you have until October 7,2024 to register to vote in the upcoming election. You can register to vote at <u>https://olvr.ohiosos.gov.</u>

It is not too late to check your voter registration status. Do it now! October 7 is the deadline!
