# Sr. Mary Jean' Reflection

Today we welcome the members of the Ancient Order of Hibernians from the South Euclid Chapter.

The east side Irish community of Cleveland has a long and storied history with St. Aloysius Parish. For many years the parish boasted a predominately Irish membership with few German and Italian families also represented.

The Ancient Order of Hibernians was established in New York City and in the coal mining region of Pennsylvania around 1836. Members must be male, Catholic, and Irish (or of Irish descent). Its biggest membership is in the United States of America. It is the oldest Catholic lay organization in the world. A women's auxiliary – the daughters of Erin – was formed around 1897. It is now known as Ladies Ancient Order of Hibernians.

It came at a time of heightened anti-Catholic bigotry against incoming Irish immigrants. Catholic churches and convents were burned down, sick Irish railroad workers were refused medical treatment, and Irish neighborhoods in cities like New York were routinely attacked.

Today the AOH continues to help incoming lrish immigrants and also aims to foster and protect elements of Irish culture such as Irish dance and sports. The group also sponsors activities to raise money for a variety of scholarships and charitable causes.

We welcome them today as part of the rich heritage that established and formed our parish in faith and community service from its earliest beginnings.
