# Sr. Mary Jean' s Column

Lenten Reflection #1 March 9, 2025

DON'T GIVE UP CHOCOLATE OR ALCOHOL OR SCREEN TIME THIS LENT AND FEEL YOU HAVE ACCOMPLISHED SOMETHING! IT IS MERELY A TRAP TO LULL US INTO THINKING THAT WE HAVE DONE SOMETHING NOBLE, SOMETHING GOOD, SOMETHING ADMIRABLE.

DON'T GIVE UP SOMETHING THIS LENT...DO SOMETHING THIS LENT!!!!

We are currently in mortal danger of letting ourselves become trapped in "the other guy syndrome" like the Pharisees of old. So often we think, "it's not my fault. I shouldn't get involved. The problem is too big, my voice won't mean anything. It hasn't touched me or my family yet."

## How can I change this during Lent?

In the words of Ted Loder in his book <u>Guerrillas of</u> <u>Grace - Prayers for the Battle</u> he encourages us with the following words: <u>Catch Me in My Scurrying</u> -

Catch me in my anxious scurrying, Lord, and hold me in this Lenten season: hold my feet to the fire of your grace and make me attentive to my mortality that I may begin to die now to those things that keep me from living with you and with my neighbors on this earth; to grudges and indifference, to certainties that smother possibilities, to my fascination with false securities, to my addiction to sweatless dreams, to my arrogant insistence on how it has to be; to my corrosive fear of dying someday which eats away the wonder of living this day, and the adventure of losing my life in order to find it in you.

Catch me in my aimless scurrying, Lord, and hold me in this Lenten season: hold my heart to the beat of your grace and create in me a resting place, a kneeling place, a tip-toe place

  - in the hunger of the street people,
  - in the fear of nuclear holocaust in all people,
  - in the rage of those oppressed because of sex or race,

in the smoldering resentments of exploited third world nations,

- in the sullen apathy of the poor and ghettostrangled people,
- in my lonely doubt and limping ambivalence;

and somehow,

during this season of sacrifice, enable me to sacrifice time and possessions and securities,

to do something. . .

something about what I see, something to turn the water of my words into the wine of will and risk, into the bread of blood and blisters, into the blessedness of deed, of a cross picked up, a saviour followed.
