Sr. Mary Jean's Column

Have you noticed that spring is slowly making its presence known in our city?

Have you seen the crocus and daffodils pushing their way to the surface? Have you seen the lacy red buds that are beginning to appear on tree branches? Have you heard the birds singing early in the morning?

What a hopeful time the season of spring is for the earth, the animals, and for us! How much our world and our nation needs an infusion of hope during these chaotic and confusing days. Might the natural world offer us this respite from chaos? The inner peace that we seek in our daily lives? A unifying perspective for all of humankind amidst the divisions in our world today?

Who better to turn to than Pope Francis and his namesake, Francis of Assisi for inspiration and guidance as to how to discover an inner peace through nature.

In his encyclical <u>Laudato Si, mi Signore</u> "Praise be to you, my Lord" Pope Francis uses the writings of his namesake, Francis of Assisi to remind us of our obligation to care for the earth, our common home.

Pope Francis reminds that "St. Francis was particularly concerned for God's creation and for the poor and outcast. He loved, and was deeply loved for his joy, his generous self-giving, and his openheartedness. He was a mystic and a pilgrim who lived in simplicity and in wonderful harmony with God, with others, and with nature and with himself. <u>He show us just how inseparable the bond is between concern for nature, justice for the poor, commitment to society, and interior peace.</u>"

How can we apply this to our daily lives? How can we access that inner peace that nature can bring to us?

Beginning in our own yards we can uncover flower beds and marvel at the green plants that are already peeking their heads through the cold soil as we reflect on how life returns after the snowy winter months. We can prune the shrubs and bushes around our property and think about how Jesus talks about the need to prune away from our lives the dead branches or clutter in our souls. We can pick up litter on our street and reflect on how care of the earth is everyone's job instead of shaking our heads and lamenting the folks who threw it there.

God has surrounded us with the hope and promise of new life. How will I, like Francis, tap into its lifegiving power to grow peace in my soul?


