The same month, commenting on DEI, he said: "If I see a Black pilot, I'm going to be like, 'Boy, I hope he's qualified."

Do I think Barron cares about racism and anti-immigrant sentiment? I truly hope so, especially since he's a bishop in a Church that proclaims that immigrants and people of color are image-bearers of God. But if he truly cares, and wants to lead those under him towards Christ, i. To do that, though, means to face reality and not sugarcoat reprehensible ideologies.

Charlie Kirk didn't deserve to be shot, but we shouldn't make him into a martyr or an example of Christian compassion and discourse. Otherwise, those who look up to spiritual leaders like Bishop Barron will assume Kirk's comments and stances are indeed like those of Jesus. A basic look at Scripture and Catholic social teachings shows otherwise.

We have begun once again to have our anti-violence witness on the front steps after Mass. This is a small but important way to continue to keep this important issue before everyone in the neighborhood.
